These course fees do not cover the fees for mandatory associated activities, i.e. the fees for personal therapy, external supervision or the residential integration/retreat weekend are not included in the quoted fees.

Fees may increase in line with changes in the Consumer Price Index.

*An additional QQI Certification Fee of €200 also applies in the final year of the programme.

Applicants are invited to complete and return this application form, with all relevant supporting documentation. Applications must be accompanied by a deposit of €250, which is subsequently credited against course fees if the applicant is admitted onto the programme.

Applicants are entitled to a full refund of this €250 deposit if they decide to cancel within 7 days of receipt of their application.

Should an application be unsuccessful or cancelled by the applicant following this 7-day period, an administration fee of €100 is retained, and the balance of €150 is refunded to the applicant.

Interviews: Admission interviews will be arranged for suitable applicants by ICPPD.

Registration: Applicants who are offered a place will be required to confirm acceptance of their place by: (a) completing an ICPPD Registration Form; (b) supplying a passport photo (i.e. normally by sending a JPEG image file) to ICPPD; (c) completing a National Vetting (NVB1) Form; and (d) paying a Registration Fee of an additional €1,000.

The balance of the fees for the year is payable, in full, before the course commences, or by availing of an agreed ICPPD payment plan.

Once an applicant accepts a place on an ICPPD programme, any fees paid become subject to the ICPPD's Financial Terms & Conditions, which outlines the College's policies in relation to refunds, payment plan, etc. [ref www.icppd.com for more information].

Induction: Learners are required to attend a mandatory Induction Session in Athlone, prior to programme commencement, to meet with their tutor(s), their class group, and gain further information about the content of the course, available learner supports, the rules and regulations of ICPPD, and the relevant Professional Codes of Ethics and Practice.

Delivery: The programme runs every second weekend: Saturday and Sunday (9.30am-5.00pm) during the academic year. Clinical Practice sessions may be scheduled for a Friday evening.

Please Note: There may be a requirement to attend 2 course/progression meetings on a weekday (each academic year) these dates will be identified to learners on their timetable at the commencement of each academic year.

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
